

# Available Labor Force in Southern Middle Tennessee An Underemployment Study

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# **Research Questions**

- What are the general characteristics of population over 18 in the seven-county study region (LWIA 6)?
- II. What is the number of available workers defined as "unemployed," "underemployed," and "marginally attached"?
- III. What are the specific characteristics of available labor force (i.e., education, skilled trade, wage rate, and mobility) in the study region?




# Study Background

- This study is sponsored by Local Workforce Investment Area 6 (LWIA 6) and the industrial development boards of Bedford, Coffee, Franklin, Grundy, Lincoln, Moore, and Warren counties.
- The survey for this study was conducted by Mid-South Survey Research Center, University of Memphis, in July 2009.
- A total number of valid phone interviews is 1,234.




### • Distribution of completed surveys by county (%)

What are the general characteristics of population over 18 in the seven-county study region (LWIA 6)?

- An estimated 176,090 people over 18 reside in the region.
- The area labor force totals 111,333 with a labor force participation rate of 63.23 percent.
  - 92,584 people are either employed working for someone/a company or self-employed, representing 52.58 percent of the population over 18.
  - 18,523 people are unemployed with an unemployment rate of 16.64 percent as of mid to late July 2009.
- Overall, one (1) in every three (3) people in the area labor force has educational attainment of associate degree or above.



What is the number of available workers defined as "unemployed," "underemployed," and "marginally attached"?

- Available labor force includes three segments of population over 18: unemployed, underemployed, and all marginally attached.
  - An estimated 47,253 people are available for work in the seven-county region.
    - ✓ 18,523 people are unemployed.
    - ✓ 18,055 people are underemployed.
    - 10,675 people are discouraged workers and other marginally attached.



What is the portion of available labor force defined as "unemployed," "underemployed," and "marginally attached"?

□19.5 percent of employed workers are underemployed.

An estimated 32.86 percent of the labor force is either unemployed or underemployed.

Combined, the potentially available labor force is 39 percent of the labor force plus all marginally attached.



 Age, Gender, and Education
 54 percent of underemployed workers are between 18 and 34 years old.

Underemployment is prevalent among both males and females almost equally.

The underemployed are better educated than the unemployed or all marginally attached.



### Skilled Trade

Nearly 28,000 individuals who are available for work, representing about 60 percent of the total available labor force, have at least one trade skill.

582 underemployed workers indicated that they have all of the following: occupational license, professional certificates, skilled trade, and local job readiness training.



- What skilled workers top the list?
  - □1,324 carpenters
  - □1,035 machinists
  - **7**754 electricians and engineering technicians
  - □675 automotive service technicians and mechanics
  - □ 579 welders
  - 449 industrial machinery mechanics



- Wage Rate and Mobility
  Wage expectations of the available labor force are not high.
  - 6,264 individuals are willing to accept a wage rate of less than \$7, below the federal minimum wage.
  - ✓ 14,906 individuals are willing to accept less than \$8.
  - 20,470 individuals (43.47 percent of the available labor force) are willing to accept less than \$9.



- Wage Rate and Mobility
  Many individuals are willing to commute more than 20 miles for the job they want.
  - ✓ 3,165 individuals are willing to commute more than 50 miles.
  - ✓ 11,494 individuals are willing to commute more than 30 miles.
  - 23,674 individuals (50.25 percent of the available workforce) are willing to commute more than 20 miles for a new job.



### Conclusion

- The study region's available labor force is more than twice as large as the one reflected in official unemployment figures.
- Overall, the seven-county study region offers a healthy labor pool to prospective businesses or businesses expanding in the region.

Labor Force Status of Population Over 18 by Age (LWIA 6)

Notes:

(1) Employed = This segment includes both employed and self-employed, who are content with their current job arrangements.

(2) Job Shifters = This segment includes those employed but willing to change their jobs. However, they are not currently looking for a job

(3) Underemployed = This segment includes those who are employed but not fully utilized in their current jobs. They are willing to work additional ahours and actively looking for a new job.

(4) Not in Labor Force = This segment includes those who are not in the labor force and not interested in the job market.

(5) All Marginally Attached = This segment includes those who are not in the labor force due to economic conditions and other barriers to employment but willing to work.

(6) Other: Not in Labor Force but Has Interest in Job Market = This segment includes those who are not in the labor force but show some interest in the job market. This segment of the population primarily includes retirees and students.
