RESULTS FROM JUNE 15, 2011

Feature 119 continues to yield an interesting assemblage of artifacts – including this siltstone abrader. The groove across the middle is from sharpening objects – probably in this case, some kind of groundstone woodworking tools (axes, adzes, chisels).
