RESULTS FROM JUNE 23, 2011

Further excavation on the pre-mound surface revealed a very clear outline of the pit – along with a cluster of ash in the southeastern that appears to be a hearth or firepit.



Cleaning of the top of the feature yielded a large fragment of a hooded bottle – the opening of the bottle is on the side (facing to the left below).



Atop Mound 3, excavations continue to reveal the large clay deposit – along with other features associated with our presumed structure. Below, the continuation of the clay deposit is visible at lower left. A large dark bnd runs diagonally across the center from upper left to lower right – the lighter grayish soil on the upper right is largely ash.



After getting nearly a full day or excavation completed, the threat of storms appeared once again – cutting us a couple of hours short.
